Carving Bench Provides stability and support for your work Bench Keeps your work securely in place while carving

Wood Files and Rasps Useful for smoothing and refining surfaces

Sandpaper For finishing your carving Start with coarser grits and gradually move to finer ones

2 BeginnerFriendly Woods

Basswood Soft easy to carve and readily available making it ideal for beginners Its relatively inexpensive and holds detail well

Pine Another softwood pine is readily available and affordable However it can be prone to splintering requiring careful attention

Balsa Extremely soft and lightweight balsa is perfect for practicing techniques and creating delicate designs Its also ideal for larger projects where weight is a concern

Intermediate to Advanced Woods

Maple

A hardwood offering a more challenging but rewarding carving experience Its strong durable and takes a fine polish Oak A strong and dense hardwood oak requires more effort to carve but produces beautiful longlasting results Cherry Known for its rich color and smooth texture cherry is a beautiful wood for more advanced carvers Remember to consider the woods grain and knots Avoid knots as they can cause unpredictable cracking and splitting during carving

- 1 Roughing Out Begin by sketching your design onto the wood Then using your whittling knife or gouges remove large amounts of wood to establish the overall shape and form of your carving
