a flock of birds was moving toward me along the river hovering over something floating on the water it drifteddownstream closer and closer until finally it bumped up against the dock though it was covered with leaves and branches now i could tell that it was a raft i reached down and pushed some of the leaves aside beneath them was a drawing of a rabbit it looked like those ancient cave paintings i d seen in books just outlines but wild and fast and free nicky isn t one bit happy about spending the summer with his grandma in the wisconsin woods but then the raft appears and changes everything as nicky explores the raft works a subtle magic opening up the wonders all around him the animals of river and woods his grandmother s humor and wisdom and his own special talent as an artist

the raft that carries huck and jim down the mississippi river is often seen as a symbol of adventure and freedom but the physical specifics of the raft itself are rarely considered peter beidler shows that understanding the material world of huckleberry finn its limitations and possibilities is vital to truly understanding mark twain s novel he illustrates how experts on twain s works have misinterpreted important aspects of the story due to their unfamiliarity with the various rivercraft that figure in the book huck and jim s little raft is not made of logs as it is often depicted in illustrations but of sawn planks and it was originally part of a much larger raft beidler explains why this matters and describes the other rivercraft that appear in the book he gives what will almost certainly be the last word on the vexed question of whether the lengthy raft episode removed at the publisher s suggestion from the novel should be restored to its original place

this story links two men from atlanta georgia and a discovery of some archaeological significance they are next door neighbors friends embarking on a rafting camping trip down the chattahoochee river starting at buford dam their saga begins in mid october and is to last over a week unforeseen

circumstances radically change during the outing to the point it affects their very survival

set as the sequel to the classic american novel by mark twain the adventures of huckleberry finn has earned its rightful place as an icon in literary history poised as one of the first novels to attract the american masses with its readable text style mark twain wrote about the controversial subject matter regarding the unlikely friendship between a boy and a fugitive slave after a life changing adventure with his comrade tom sawyer huckleberry finn huck as he s known must figure out how to deal with his new life in the aftermath of finding a significant amount of money along the banks of the mississippi river protecting what s rightfully his huck keeps the money in a trust tucked away from his drunken father with the weight of numerous county judges siding with the responsibility of huck s father in securing the money huck fears his life of independence has been hopelessly squandered forced to endure confinement and relentless abuse huck takes matters into his own hands leading him on the adventure and a new friendship of a lifetime scared lonely and fiercely independent huck finn must learn that in order to survive he must become comfortable with the uncomfortable huck must learn to trust those around him and most importantly to be brave in the face of extreme hardship with an eye catching new cover and professionally typeset manuscript this version of the adventures of huckleberry finn is modern and readable

in minstrelsy and murder andrew silver locates the foundation of the south s dark humor in the great and violent cultural upheavals of the nineteenth century examining the connection between comic victimization and real acts of aggression silver shows southern humor to be a product not of america s wholeness and national unity but of its internal fears divisiveness and perpetual civil strife he focuses on the work of southern writers augustus b longstreet george washington harris charles chesnutt and mark twain exploring a strain of regional humor that runs counter to the more familiar american comic tradition a profound distress about class emerges clearly in silver s reading of longstreet s georgia sketches just as harris s post civil war stories reveal an escalating anger toward yankees emancipated african americans and upstart women twain and chesnutt however mark a turning point for southern humor silver argues by resisting entrenched comic elements of racist acts of violence and instead using narratives that turn upon and expose the destructive power of racist typing they created humor that both wounds and dares to speak of wounds with engaging critical discussion of race class and gender silver investigates the cultural fears that southern popular comedy of the 1800s addresses as well as the various

forms and voices it employed yankee humor minstrelsy sentimental fiction political broadsides ku klux klan sketches frontier humor and sadistic slapstick he shows how southern humor as the product of middle class authors who were at once outraged and eminently practical revolutionary and conformist anti authoritarian and craving the approval of authorities evolved into a genre at war with itself stifling laughter by unearthing the trauma at the core of the comic

huck finn s mythic adventures and childhood abruptly end when he steps off his raft into hurricane katrina huck finn and jim float on their raft across a continuum of shifting seasons feasting on a limitless supply of fish and stolen provisions propelled by the currents of the mighty mississippi from one adventure to the next launched into existence by mark twain they have now been transported by norman lock through three vital violent and transformative centuries of american history as time unfurls on the river s banks they witness decisive battles of the civil war the betrayal of reconstruction s promises to the freed slaves the crushing of native american nations and the electrification of a continent while jim enters real time when he disembarks the raft in the jim crow south huck finally comes of age when he s washed up on shore during hurricane katrina an old man in 2077 huck takes stock of his life and narrates his own story revealing our nation s past present and future as mark twain could never have dreamed it the first stand alone book in the american novels series the boy in his winter is a tour de force work of imagination beauty and courage that re envisions a great american literary classic for our time

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
